Notwithstanding the complexity and high costs of putting in place a HNS marine pollution response system, safety risks and impacts to the public, the marine environment and the responding personnel associated with HNS can be potentially severe and thus the need for littoral States to develop appropriate systems for preparedness and response to HNS marine pollution.
